

# The Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul

5:00 p.m., Saturday, January 25, 2025 (Year C)

The texts found below are those of the chants and prayers which change each week and are sung by the choir and celebrant alone.

**Members of the congregation are invited to join the choir in the chants that are printed with music in the Mass booklet (“Sancta Eucharistia”).**

## (1) *Introitus* 2 Timothy 1:12; Psalm 139

Scio cui credidi, et certus sum, quia potens est depositum meum servare in illum diem. *Ps.* Domine probasti me, et cognovisti me: tu cognovisti sessionem meam, et resurrectionem meam.

I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. *V.* LORD, you have searched me out and known me; you know my sitting down and my rising up.

## (2) *Collecta*

Deus, qui universum mundum per beati Pauli Apostoli praedicationem Evangelica luce illustrasti: Da nobis quaesumus, ut propter eius admirabilem Conversionem quam recolimus, doctrinae eius sanctae oboediendo, tibi gratias referamus; per Iesum Christum Dominum nostrum, qui tecum vivit et regnat in unitate Spiritus Sancti, Deus, per omnia saecula saeculorum. *Amen.*

O God, by the preaching of your apostle Paul you have caused the light of the Gospel to shine throughout the world: Grant, we pray, that we, having his wonderful conversion in remembrance, may show ourselves thankful to you by following his holy teaching; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

***Epistola (Epistle Reading):*** Galatians 1:11-24

## (3) *Alleluia*

Alleluia. Magnus sanctus Paulus, vas electionis, vere digne est glorificandus, qui et meruit thronum duodecimum possidere.

Alleluia. Great and holy is Paul, the choice vessel, truly and rightly to be glorified, and to inherit the twelfth throne.

***Evangelium (Gospel Reading):*** Matthew 10:16-22

## (4) *Offertorium* Psalm 139: 17

Mihi autem nimis honorati sunt amici tui, Deus: nimis confortatus est principatus eorum.

How dear to me are your friends, O God: their rule and governance are exceedingly steadfast.

**(5) Praefatio De Apostolis**

Per Iesum Christum Dominum nostrum, gregis tui pastorem magnum; qui post resurrectionem apostolos suos legavit ad praedicandum Evangelium et omnes gentes docendas; et promisit ut cum eis maneat omnibus diebus usque ad consummationem saeculi.

Through the great shepherd of your flock, Jesus Christ our Lord; who after his resurrection sent forth his apostles to preach the Gospel and to teach all nations; and promised to be with them always, even to the end of the ages.

**(6) Communio Mark 16: 17-18**

Signa eos qui in me credunt, haec sequentur: daemonia eicient: super aegros manus imponent, et bene habebunt.

These signs will follow those who believe in me: they will cast out demons; they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will recover.

**(7) Postcommunio**

Sacramenta quae sumpsimus, Domine Deus noster, in nobis foveant caritatis ardorem, quo beatus apostolus Paulus vehementer accensus, omnium pertulit sollicitudinem Ecclesiarum. Per Christum Dominum nostrum. *Amen.*

May the Sacrament we have received, O Lord our God, stir up in us that fire of charity with which the blessed Apostle Paul burned ardently as he bore his concern for all the Churches; through Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
