

Eve of the Third Sunday after Epiphany

5:00 p.m., Saturday, January 22, 2022 (Year C)

The texts found below are those of the chants and prayers which change each week and are sung by the choir and celebrant alone.

Members of the congregation are invited to join the choir in the chants that are printed with music in the Mass booklet (“Sancta Eucharistia”).

(1) Introitus Psalm 97: 7, 8, and 1

Adorate Deum omnes angeli eius: audivit, et laetata est Sion: et exultaverunt filiae Iudae. Ps. Dominus regnavit, exsultet terra: laetentur insulae multae.

Bow down before God, all you angels of his. Zion hears and is glad, and the cities of Judah rejoice. V. The LORD is King; let the earth rejoice; let the multitude of the isles be glad.

(2) Collecta

Da nobis gratiam, Domine, ad libenter sequendam vocationem Salvatoris nostri Iesu Christi, et omnibus hominibus Evangelium salutis eius pronuntiandum, ut nos cum toto mundo gloriam mirabilium operum eius percipiamus; per eundem Dominum nostrum Iesum Christum Filium tuum, qui tecum vivit et regnat in unitate Spiritus Sancti, Deus, per omnia saecula saeculorum. *Amen.*

Give us grace, O Lord, to answer readily the call of our Savior Jesus Christ and proclaim to all people the Good News of his salvation, that we and the whole world may perceive the glory of his marvelous works; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

Epistola (Epistle Reading): 1 Corinthians 12:12-31a

(3) Alleluia Psalm 97: 1

Alleluia. Dominus regnavit, exsultet terra: laetentur insulae multae.

Alleluia. The LORD is King; let the earth rejoice; let the multitude of the isles be glad.

Evangelium (Gospel Reading): Luke 4:14-21

(4) Offertorium Psalm 118: 16, 17

Dextera Domini fecit virtutem, dextera Domini exaltavit me: non moriar, sed vivam, et narrabo opera Domini.

The right hand of the LORD has triumphed! the right hand of the LORD is exalted! I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the LORD.

(5) Praefatio

Creator lucis et fons vitae, qui nos fecisti in imagine tua, et nos vocasti in vitam novam in Iesu Christo Domino nostro.

For you are the source of light and life, you made us in your image, and called us to new life in Jesus Christ our Lord.

(6) *Communio* Nehemiah 8:10

Comedite pingua, et bibite mulsum, et mittite partes eis qui non praeparaverunt sibi: sanctus enim dies Domini est, nolite contristari: gaudium etenim Domini est fortitudo nostra.

Go your way, eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions of them to those for whom nothing is prepared, for this day is holy to our Lord; and do not be grieved, for the joy of the Lord is your strength.

(7) *Postcommunio*

Praesta nobis, quaesumus, omnipotens Deus, ut vivificationis tuae gratiam consequentes, in tuo semper munere gloriemur; per Christum Dominum nostrum. *Amen.*

Grant, we pray, almighty God: that we, who by your grace have received the bread of life, may evermore glory in the gift which we have received; through Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
