

Eve of the Second Sunday after the Epiphany

5:00 p.m., Saturday, January 17, 2026 (Year A)

The texts found below are those of the chants and prayers which change each week and are sung by the choir and celebrant alone.

Members of the congregation are invited to join the choir in the chants that are printed with music in the Mass booklet (“*Sancta Eucharistia*”).

(1) Introitus Psalm 66: 3 and 1

Omnis terra adoret te, Deus, et psallat tibi: psalmum dicat nomini tuo, Altissime.
Ps. Iubilate Deo omnis terra, psalmum dicite nomini eius; date gloriam laudi eius.

All the earth bows down before you, sings to you, sings out your Name, O Most High. V. Be joyful in God, all you lands; sing the glory of his Name; sing the glory of his praise.

(2) Collecta

Omnipotens Deus, cuius Filius Salvator noster Iesus Christus lux mundi est: Concede ut plebs tua illuminata per Verbum tuum et Sacramenta cum splendore gloriae Christi eluceat, ut ille ad fines terrarum cognoscatur, adoretur et audiatur; per eundem Dominum nostrum Iesum Christum, qui tecum vivit et regnat in unitate Spiritus Sancti, Deus, per omnia saecula saeculorum. *Amen.*

Almighty God, whose Son our Savior Jesus Christ is the light of the world: Grant that your people, illumined by your Word and Sacraments, may shine with the radiance of Christ's glory, that he may be known, worshiped, and obeyed to the ends of the earth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

Epistola (*Epistle Reading*): 1 Corinthians 1:1-9

(3) Alleluia Psalm 148:2

Alleluia. Laudate Deum omnes angeli eius: laudate eum omnes virtutes eius.

Alleluia. Praise God, all you angels of his; praise him, all his host.

Evangelium (*Gospel Reading*): John 1:29-42

(4) Offertorium Psalm 66: 1, 2, 16

Iubilate Deo universa terra: iubilate Deo universa terra: psalmum dicite nomini eius: venite, et audite, et narrabo vobis, omnes qui timetis Deum, quanta fecit Dominus animae meae, alleluia.

Be joyful in God, all you lands; sing the glory of his Name; come and listen, all you who fear God, and I will tell you what he has done for me, alleluia.

(5) Praefatio

Creator lucis et fons vitae, qui nos fecisti in imagine tua, et nos vocasti in vitam novam in Iesu Christo Domino nostro.

For you are the source of light and life, you made us in your image, and called us to new life in Jesus Christ our Lord.

(6) Communio *Psalm 20: 5*

Laetabimur in salutari tuo: et in nomine Domini Dei nostri magnificabimur.

We will shout for joy at your victory, and triumph in the Name of our God.

(7) Postcommunio

Spiritum nobis, Domine, tuae caritatis infunde, ut, quos uno caelesti pane stiasti, una facias pietate concordēs; per Christum Dominum nostrum. *Amen.*

Pour out upon us the Spirit of your love, O Lord: and grant in your mercy that those whom you have nourished with one heavenly bread may be made one in heart and mind; through Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
