

Eve of the Third Sunday after Pentecost

The Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Proper 5 (Year B)

5:00 p.m., Saturday, June 8, 2024

The texts found below are those of the chants and prayers which change each week and are sung by the choir and celebrant alone.

Members of the congregation are invited to join the choir in the chants that are printed with music in the Mass booklet (“Sancta Eucharistia”).

(1) Introitus Psalm 130: 3, 4 and 1

Si iniquitates observeris Domine, Domine quis sustinebit? quia apud te propitiatio est, Deus Israel. Ps. De profundis clamavi ad te Domine: Domine exaudi vocem meam.

If you, LORD, were to note what is done amiss, O LORD, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with you, O God of Israel. V. Out of the depths have I called to you, O LORD; LORD, hear my voice.

(2) Collecta

Deus, a quo bona cuncta procedunt, largire supplicibus tuis, ut cogitemus te inspirante, quae recta sunt, et te gubernante, eadem faciamus; per Iesum Christum Dominum nostrum, qui tecum vivit et regnat in unitate Spiritus Sancti, Deus, per omnia saecula saeculorum. *Amen.*

O God, from whom all good proceeds: Grant that by your inspiration we may think those things that are right, and by your merciful guiding may do them; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

Epistola (Epistle Reading): 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

(3) Alleluia Psalm 9: 4, 9

Alleluia. Deus, qui sedes super thronum et iudicas aequitatem: esto refugium pauperum in tribulatione.

Alleluia. O God, you sit upon your throne judging right: be a refuge for the oppressed, a refuge in time of trouble.

Evangelium (Gospel Reading): Mark 3:20-35

(4) Offertorium Psalm 13: 3, 4

Illumina oculos meos, nequando obdormiam in morte: nequando dicat inimicus meus: Praevalui adversus eum.

Give light to my eyes, lest I sleep in death; Lest my enemy say, “I have prevailed over him.”

(5) Praefatio

Creator lucis et fons vitae, qui nos fecisti in imagine tua, et nos vocasti in vitam novam in Iesu Christo Domino nostro.

For you are the source of light and life, you made us in your image, and called us to new life in Jesus Christ our Lord.

(6) Communio Matthew 12: 50

Quicumque fecerit voluntatem Patris mei, qui in caelis est: ipse meus frater, soror, et mater est, dicit Dominus.

Whosoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother, my sister, and my mother, says the Lord.

(7) Postcommunio

Tua nos, Domine, medicinalis operatio, et a nostris perversitatibus clementer expediat, et ad ea quae sunt recta perducatur; per Christum Dominum nostrum. *Amen.*

Almighty and everlasting God, you have made us partakers of the bread of heaven: pour into our hearts, we pray, the abundance of your healing grace, to set us free from the bonds of self-will and lead us in paths of righteousness; through Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
