

Eve of the Fourth Sunday after Pentecost

The Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time: Proper 6 (Year B)

5:00 p.m., Saturday, June 15, 2024

The texts found below are those of the chants and prayers which change each week and are sung by the choir and celebrant alone.

Members of the congregation are invited to join the choir in the chants that are printed with music in the Mass booklet (“*Sancta Eucharistia*”).

(1) Introitus *Psalm 27: 10, 13 and 1*

Exaudi, Domine, vocem meam, qua clamavi ad te: adiutor meus esto, ne derelinquas me neque depicias me, Deus salutaris meus. *Ps.* Dominus illuminatio mea, et salus mea: quem timebo?

Hearken to my voice, O LORD, when I call; You have been my helper; cast me not away; do not forsake me, O God of my salvation. *V.* The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom then shall I fear?

(2) Collecta

Familiam tuam, quaesumus, Domine, continua pietate custodi, ut adiutorio gratiae tuae veritatem tuam fortiter pronuntiemus, et iustitiam tuam clementer administremus; per Iesum Christum Dominum nostrum, qui tecum vivit et regnat in unitate Spiritus Sancti, Deus, per omnia saecula saeculorum. *Amen.*

Keep, O Lord, your household the Church in your steadfast faith and love, that through your grace we may proclaim your truth with boldness, and minister your justice with compassion; for the sake of our Savior Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

Epistola (*Epistle Reading*): 2 Corinthians 5:6-10,[11-13],14-17

(3) Alleluia *Psalm 21:1*

Alleluia. Domine, in virtute tua laetabitur rex: et super salutare tuum exultabit vehementer.

Alleluia. The king rejoices in your strength, O LORD; how greatly he exults in your victory!

Evangelium (*Gospel Reading*): Mark 4:26-34

(4) Offertorium *Psalm 16: 7, 8*

Benedicam Dominum, qui mihi tribuit intellectum: providebam Deum in conspectu meo semper: quoniam a dextris est mihi, ne commovear.

I will bless the LORD who gives me counsel; I have set the LORD always before me; because he is at my right hand I shall not fall.

(5) Praefatio

Creator lucis et fons vitae, qui nos fecisti in imagine tua, et nos vocasti in vitam novam in Iesu Christo Domino nostro.

For you are the source of light and life, you made us in your image, and called us to new life in Jesus Christ our Lord.

(6) Communio Psalm 27: 4

Unam petitia Domino, hanc requiram: ut inhabitem in domo Domini omnibus diebus vitae meae.

One thing have I asked of the LORD; one thing I seek; that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life.

(7) Postcommunio

Haec tua, Domine, sumpta sacra communio, sicut fidelium in te unionem praesignat, sic in ecclesia tua unitatis operetur effectum: per Christum Dominum nostrum. *Amen.*

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that this holy communion, which we have received as a sign of the unity of all the faithful in Jesus Christ your Son, may bring to your Church the blessings of peace and unity which it signifies; through Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
