

Eve of the Fourth Sunday of Easter

5:00 p.m., Saturday, April 20, 2024 (Year B)

The texts found below are those of the chants and prayers which change each week and are sung by the choir and celebrant alone.

Members of the congregation are invited to join the choir in the chants that are printed with music in the Mass booklet (“*Sancta Eucharistia*”).

(1) Introitus Psalm 33: 5, 6 and 1

Misericordia Domini plena est terra, alleluia: verbo Dei caeli firmati sunt, alleluia, alleluia. Ps. Exsultate iusti in Domino: rectos decet collaudatio.

The loving kindness of the LORD fills the whole earth, alleluia; by the word of the LORD were the heavens made, alleluia, alleluia. V. Rejoice in the LORD, you righteous; it is good for the just to sing praises.

(2) Collecta

Deus, cuius Filius Iesus pastor bonus plebis tuae est: Concede ut, quando vocem eius audiamus, qui nos quemque nomine vocat eum cognoscamus, et quo ducit sequamur; per eundem Dominum nostrum Iesum Christum, Filium tuum, qui tecum vivit et regnat in unitate Spiritus Sancti, Deus, per omnia saecula saeculorum. *Amen.*

O God, whose Son Jesus is the good shepherd of your people: Grant that when we hear his voice we may know him who calls us each by name, and follow where he leads; who, with you and the Holy Spirit, lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

Lecto Prima (First Reading): Acts 4:5-12

(3) Alleluia John 10:14

Alleluia. Ego sum pastor bonus: et cognosco oves meas, et cognoscunt me meae.

Alleluia. I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my own know me.

Evangelium (Gospel Reading): John 10:11-18

(4) Offertorium Psalm 63: 1, 4

Deus, Deus meus, ad te de luce vigilo: et in nomine tuo levabo manus meas, alleluia.

O God, you are my God; eagerly I seek you; and lift up my hands in your Name, alleluia.

(5) Praefatio

Et te quidem omni tempore, sed in hoc potissimum gloriosius praedicare, cum Pascha nostrum immolatus est Christus. Ipse enim est vere Agnus, qui abstulit peccata mundi: qui mortem nostram moriendo destruxit, et vitam resurgendo reparavit.

But chiefly are we bound to praise you for the glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; for he is the true Paschal Lamb, who was sacrificed for us, and has taken away the sin of the world. By his death he has destroyed death, and by his rising to life again he has won for us everlasting life.

(6) Communio John 10:14

Ego sum pastor bonus: et cognosco oves meas, et cognoscunt me meae, alleluia, alleluia

I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my own know me, alleluia, alleluia.

(7) Postcommunio

Gregem tuum, Pastor bone, placatus intende, et oves, quas pretioso Filii tui sanguine redemisti, in aeternis pascuis collocare digneris; qui vivit et regnat in saecula saeculorum. *Amen.*

Incline your ear to the prayers of your flock, good Shepherd: and gather into your heavenly fold the sheep redeemed by the precious blood of your Son, who lives and reigns for ever and ever. *Amen.*
