

# The Feast of Saint Andrew the Apostle

5:00 p.m., Saturday, November 23, 2024

*The texts found below are those of the chants and prayers which change each week and are sung by the choir and celebrant alone.*

**Members of the congregation are invited to join the choir in the chants that are printed with music in the Mass booklet (“*Sancta Eucharistia*”).**

## **(1) Introitus** *Matthew 4:18, 19; Psalm 19*

Dominus secus mare Galilaeae vidit duos fratres, Petrum et Andream, et vocavit eos: Venite post me: faciam vos fieri piscatores hominum. *Ps.* Caeli enarrant gloriam Dei: et opera manum eius annuntiat firmamentum.

Walking by the sea of Galilee, the Lord saw two brothers, Peter and Andrew, and called to them: Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men. *V.* The heavens declare the glory of God, and the firmament shows his handiwork.

## **(2) Collecta**

Omnipotens Deus, qui tantam gratiam apostolo tuo Andreae dedisti ut vocationi Filii tui Iesu Christi libenter oboediverit, et secum fratrem suum tulerit: Da nobis gratiam, qui per Verbum tuum vocamur, ut Dominum sine mora sequamur, et proximos nostros in praesentiam benignam eius ducamus; per eundem Dominum nostrum Iesum Christum, qui tecum vivit et regnat in unitate Spiritus Sancti, Deus, per omnia saecula saeculorum. *Amen.*

Almighty God, who gave such grace to your apostle Andrew that he readily obeyed the call of your Son Jesus Christ, and brought his brother with him: Give us, who are called by your holy Word, grace to follow him without delay, and to bring those near to us into his gracious presence; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

Alleluia. Dilexit Andream Dominus in odorem suavitatis.

Alleluia. The Lord loved Andrew as an odor of sweetness.

**Evangelium** (*Gospel Reading*): Matthew 4:18-22

## **(4) Offertorium** *Psalm 139:17*

Mihi autem nimis honorati sunt amici tui, Deus: nimis confortatus est principatus eorum.

How dear to me are your friends, O God: their rule and governance are exceedingly steadfast.

**(5) Praefatio De Apostolis**

Per Iesum Christum Dominum nostrum, gregis tui pastorem magnum; qui post resurrectionem apostolos suos legavit ad praedicandum Evangelium et omnes gentes docendas; et promisit ut cum eis maneat omnibus diebus usque ad consummationem saeculi.

Through the great shepherd of your flock, Jesus Christ our Lord; who after his resurrection sent forth his apostles to preach the Gospel and to teach all nations; and promised to be with them always, even to the end of the ages.

**(6) Communio Matthew 4:19, 20**

Venite post me: faciam vos fieri piscatores hominum: at illi, relictis retibus et navi, secuti sunt Dominum.

Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men: and, leaving their nets and their boat, they followed the Lord.

**(7) Postcommunio**

Roboret nos, Domine, sacramenti tui communio, ut, exemplo beati Andreae apostoli, Christi mortificationem ferentes, cum ipso vivere mereamur in gloria. Qui vivit et regnat in saecula saeculorum. *Amen.*

May communion in your sacrament strengthen us, O Lord, so that by the example of blessed Andrew the apostle we, who carry in our body the death of Christ, may be made worthy to live with him in glory. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. *Amen.*
